

What We're Doing About COVID-19

STAYING INFORMED

We are continuing to monitor the Center of Disease Control and Prevention website and are regularly in contact with the County Health Departments to identify any new information or advisories. We will continue keeping families informed of how any changes impact New Day's protocols.

CLEANING/SANITIZING/DISINFECTING

These procedures include:

- Washing and sanitizing hands **frequently**, and especially before eating
- Avoiding touching nose, mouth, eyes
- Sanitizing frequently touched surfaces:
 - Door knobs and handles
 - Faucets and toilet trip levers
 - Tabletops and counter tops
 - Appliance handles and controls
 - Arms of chairs
 - Phones, computers keyboards, elevator, and accessories
- In short: wide variety of items that we touch and handle throughout the day

MASKS AND SOCIAL DISTANCING

- All staff wear masks while at the program
- Participants will wear masks as able
- Chairs are spread out 6 feet apart with only 2 participants per table. Each table has plexi-glass on providing extra separation between participants

HELP STOP THE SPREAD OF COVID-19

To help us stop the spread of Covid-19 we are requesting that any caregiver, participant, staff, or visitor remain out of our program and seek medical care if:

- You have a fever of 100 degrees or higher
- You are coughing, have difficulty breathing or are short of breath
- You have a sore throat, chills, headache, muscle or body aches, vomiting, diarrhea or loss of taste or smell, new confusion, inability to wake or stay awake, blueish lips or face
- You have been in close contact (15 minutes closer than 6 feet) with someone diagnosed with Covid-19 within the last 14 days

IF COVID-19 IS DETECTED

In the event that one of our participants or staff show symptoms (fever, cough, shortness of breath, vomiting, diarrhea, muscle & body aches, loss in taste & smell), he/she will be isolated away from others immediately. If it is a participant, the caregiver will be called to promptly pick up the participants, and seek medical care. If the participants symptoms are suddenly severe, 9-1-1 will be immediately called. If a staff member has symptoms, he/she will be asked to go home and seek medical clearance before returning to work.
