Fear abounds today. Everybody's afraid of something. "I'm afraid it's going to rain today." "I'm afraid my team doesn't stand a chance." "I'm afraid I'm going to have to ask you to leave." "I'm quite afraid I don't know what you're talking about." See what I mean? It's everywhere.

That was meant to be funny. But fear is anything but funny, for lots of reasons. Real fear of terrorism, real fear of economic failure, real fear of societal mayhem, real fear of health issues. People are afraid to let their kids out of their sight. They're afraid to walk alone at night. They're afraid something will happen on the flight. In spite of the marvelous rhyming pattern of those previous statement, they scratch the surface of fear. Fear paralyzes. It causes debilitating stress. Fear can actually kill.

So why is it, then, that so many have this tantalizing love affair with fear? We are entering into the season of fear. For the next several weeks, culminating at the last day (of the month), many will seek to be frightened, not just frightened, but drain-your-face, buckle-your-knees, scream-involuntarily frightened. For my part, I have never understood this. I have never wanted to.

When my Bible says that we are to focus on what is wholesome, what is pure, what is praiseworthy, and when my Bible says we are to avoid and shun evil, I have a hard time reconciling many Christian's actions over this next month. I am not here to judge or to condemn, and believe me, there is a lot in my own life I need to get fixed. So it's not about pointing fingers or playing a blame game. I just don't think I want anyone or anything other than Jesus taking credit for my fun.

This world, world system, and world usurper (read Satan) feed on fear. The Devil knows if he can keep the saints fearful and afraid nothing good will get done. So many churches don't take a risk on ministry because they're afraid of the possibility of failure.

The Bible teaches and encourages us to kick the fear habit. Jesus said in Luk 12:32, "Do not fear, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom." Hebrews 2:14-15 has a neat little summary of the Gospel, and why Jesus came in the first place: "Inasmuch then as the children have partaken of flesh and blood, He Himself likewise shared in the same, that through death He might destroy him who had the power of death, that is, the devil, and release those who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage."

Agenda 21

Faith's Book Club selection for the month of October is *Agenda 21* by Glenn Beck. The Club will meet on Thursday, October 17, starting with dinner at 5:30 PM at Guadalajara, followed by Book Club at 7PM in the church office.

About Agenda 21...

"I was just a baby when we were relocated and I don't remember much. Everybody has that black hole at the beginning of their life. That time you can't remember. Your first step. Your first taste of table food. My real memories Begin in our assigned living are in Compound 14."

Just a generation ago, this place was called America. Now, after the worldwide implementation of a UN-led program called Agenda 21, it's simply known as "the Republic." There is no president. No Congress. No Supreme Court. No freedom. There are only the Authorities.

Citizens have two primary goals in the new Republic: to create clean energy and to create new human life. Those who cannot do either are of no use to society. This bleak and barren existence is all that eighteen-year-old Emmeline has ever known. She dutifully walks her energy board daily and accepts all male pairings assigned to her by the Authorities. Like most citizens, she keeps her head down and her eyes closed. Until they come for her mother. "You save what you think you're going to lose."

Woken up to the harsh reality of her life and her family's future inside the Republic, Emmeline begins to search for the truth. Why are all citizens confined to ubiquitous concrete living spaces? Why are Compounds guarded by Gatekeepers who track all movements? Why are food, water and energy rationed so strictly? And, most important, why are babies taken from their mothers at birth? As Emmeline begins to understand the true objectives of Agenda 21 she realizes that she is up against far more than she ever thought. With the Authorities closing in, and nowhere to run, Emmeline embarks on an audacious plan to save her family and expose the Republic—but is she already too late?
