Holy Communion

In this Sacrament, Jesus gives us Himself, His true Body and Blood as we receive the bread and wine. Jesus instituted this when he celebrated Passover with his disciples, and assures us that each time we receive it, we again remember his death and receive the full benefits of His grace and all that he offers. In keeping with the Scripture and the teachings of the Lutheran church, we ask each person to consider these questions:

- *Do I acknowledge the fact that I am indeed a sinner and that I am sorry for my sins?
- *Do I believe that Jesus Christ is my Savior from all sin?
- *Am I trusting in Jesus' promise that I receive full forgiveness and strength through this Sacrament?
- *Do I believe and agree that the body and blood of my Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, are truly present in, with and under the bread and wine?
- *With the Lord's help, will I seek to amend my sinful life and live in conformity with His holy will?

If you answer yes to all these questions and are baptized, you are welcome to come and receive all that Jesus offers in Holy Communion. May the Lord bless your personal reception as well as your daily living under His power and blessing.

We offer assistance for the **hearing impaired**. Just speak to one of our ushers, who will be able to help you. Please return the hearing device to an usher as you exit. We have a **Nursery** for infants through age 3 that is available during of our services for you to use. The nursery is through the hall on the right side of the sanctuary (facing the altar).

First Reading: Micah 5:3-5a

² But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah, who are too little to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient days. ³Therefore he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labor has given birth; then the rest of his brothers shall return to the people of Israel. ⁴And he shall stand and shepherd his flock in the strength of the LORD, in the majesty of the name of the LORD his God. And they shall dwell secure, for now he shall be great to the ends of the earth. ⁵And he shall be their peace.

Epistle: Hebrews 10:5-10

⁵When Christ came into the world, he said, "Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body have you prepared for me; ⁶in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure. ⁷Then I said, 'Behold, I have come to do your will, O God, as it is written of me in the scroll of the book.'" ⁸When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), ⁹then he added, "Behold, I have come to do your will." He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. ¹⁰And by that will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

³⁹In those days Mary arose and went with haste into the hill country, to a town in Judah, ⁴⁰and she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. ⁴¹And when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, the baby leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit, ⁴²and she exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb! ⁴³And why is this granted to me that the mother of my Lord should come to me? ⁴⁴For behold, when the sound of your greeting came to my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. ⁴⁵And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her from the Lord."

2024 Faith Completed Projects / Year-End Giving



As a new year approaches, we wanted to give a brief update on a lot of the work that has been done this year on our facilities and grounds:

Parts of our administration building underwent a renovation/update after a major leak was discovered in the women's restroom. The renovation was completely funded by insurance resulting from the accident.

In honor of the Faith Lutheran Care Center's 25th Anniversary, the soft surface in the toddler playground was completely re-surfaced and improved. This project was funded by member donations and grant money awarded to our school to be used strictly on improvements such as this.

A project that was part of our sanctuary's 50th Anniversary Celebration but wasn't completed until just recently is our parking lot improvements. Lights were installed in the rear of the parking lot, and the surface was sealed and re-striped. The lights were completely funded by members.

A new sound and video system was installed in the sanctuary, again this was a project slated for the 50th Anniversary of the sanctuary, however, it took a very long time to get the equipment. This project was funded by donations as well.

A new evaporator coil was installed in the Sanctuary AC unit. Major repairs and upgrades were made to a number of AC units throughout the campus.

The 301 building had the eaves and arches re-done and repainted funded through grant money.

A fence and native shrubbery was installed along the east end of the parking lot at our Care Center. This improvement was completely funded by a caring parent of our program.

All of these and more were provided by our faithful God who is Jehovah-Jireh, the God-Who-Provides, through insurance and grants, and your faithful giving of tithes and offerings. Now is the time to ensure that your tithe is up to date.
